Collie, Collin, laid down a superb performance in Level 3 Novice Obedience which was performed entirely off leash and included a rock solid "out of sight" down-stay for two minutes. Other competitors moved up in the agility classes with

qualifying scores, including Karen Gentsch and ASCII, Freda Nichols and Jet, Lisa Bonner and Hana, and Barbara Guzzo and Shiloh.

The 4 Georgia Dog Gym "WOW" Agility Awards this year were bestowed upon the 4 competitors who stayed strong all weekend to end up competing in the last, AND THEY'LL SAY, the BEST, of all of the agility classes: SENILITY AGILITY. The object of the game of Senility Agility is to negotiate ALL of the OBSTACLES. What this meant for competitors was that if their dog ran past an obstacle or refused to do the obstacle, THE HANDLER had to complete the obstacle FOR THE DOG! Competitors were jumping the jumps, lying down on the pause table, trotting through the weave poles, and crawling through the tunnel!! It was very entertaining, to say the least!

Steve Heath and his Whippet, Starbuck, attended the American Whippet Club 24th National Specialty Show in Tucson, Arizona. This was the first AKC Agility Trial for Steve and Starbuck and they brought home a First Place Qualifying Score in AKC Agility Jumpers with Weaves. Christine Heath also competed at the Whippet National Specialty in Rally Obedience with her Whippet, Jazzy, and they earned their Rally Obedience Novice Title. The Peach Blossom Cluster is the largest AKC Dog Show in the Southeast. It is held each April at the Georgia National Fairgrounds in Perry, GA.
